Increase of knowledge about ethical principles, processes and law regulations in the field of scientific research in multicentric, international research. The goal is also strengthen research ethics capacity through increasing with in-depth knowledge of the ethical principles, processes and policies related to international clinical and public health research as well as the critical skills to develop research ethics education, and expert consultation to researchers and their institutions.				
Learning outcomes of Course unit Knowledge of ethical principles in clinical practice and research in stomatology, managing clinical practice and research in stomatology while maintaining ethical normes and acceptance of an attitude that ethics are the norm in stomatology. Use of ethical principles in design, conduct, monitoring and disseminating results of multicentric and international studies.				
Course unit contents <i>Theoretical classes</i> Concept of ethics. Ethical principles of patient treatment throughout history. Patient rights and Law of patient rights. Patient rights defender in health institutions. Capability of decision making about treatment and working capability of the patient. Principles of respect of patient privacy in stomatology. Content of information for the patient and forms of informed consent in patients. Ethical committees of health institutions: content, procedure of choosing members, work procedure, publishing opinions, procedure of application. Medical error and malpractice. Ethical aspects of working with marginal populations: children, elderly, pregnant women, poor and uneducated. Helsinki declaration and Good clinical practice. Methods of recruiting patients in clinical studies, patient insurance. Allowed financial payment for patients for being subjects in clinical studies.
